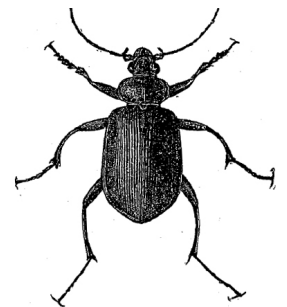
Beetle and Insect Day **at the Pales**
